

### Information For The Rail Enthusiast

In early June, a wildfire started on the south side of the Royal Gorge in Colorado. Before long, it had also spread to the north rim and destroyed some planks in the famous suspension bridge. The park lost some buildings on both sides of the gorge, along with the aerial tram. The incline railway suffered damage, as did the narrow gauge display of D&RGW #499, and caboose 0584 was lost. The standard gauge line at the bottom of the canyon seems to have avoided much disruption. Not too far from there, large fires were later threatening tourist rail operations around South Fork and Wagon Wheel Gap, but fire crews were hopeful about saving those places at the time of this writing.

Rio Grande Southern Galloping Goose #4 has returned to Telluride, Colorado. It was restored over the last four years at the Ridgway Railroad Museum and had participated in last summer's Goose Fest at the Colorado Railroad Museum in Golden.

Museum of the American Railroad's Frisco 4-8-4 #4501 has been moved from Dallas to that museum's new home in Frisco, Texas. More than 40 pieces of rolling stock are being relocated, including U.P. Big Boy #4018, and an F7 diesel.

The city of Fort Morgan, Colorado, had three ex-Great Western tank locos

on display. Number 17 previously worked in Brighton and has now gone to a museum in Gering, Nebraska.

Milwaukee Road 4-8-4 #261 pulled its first mainline public excursion in five years in early May on trackage in Minnesota. Nickel Plate #765 handled 2200 passengers on trips over Memorial Day weekend in Pennsylvania. Cass Scenic Railroad in West Virginia celebrated it's 50th anniversary in mid-June with 1922 Shay #4 providing the power then and now. The Santa Fe Southern in New Mexico will not be operating passenger trains this season between Santa Fe and Lamy.

The last World War II veteran serving in the U.S. Senate, Frank Lautenberg

of New Jersey passed away in June. He had twice received the Golden Spike Award from the National Association of Railroad Passengers for his leadership in fighting for passenger rail service. His casket traveled by Amtrak to Washington, and he was buried at Arlington National Cemetery.

Photographer John C. Illman made images that captured the steam and early diesel era on the West Coast, and this "quiet man" died in May. Visitors to the roundhouse museum in Durango, Colorado, may have learned much from Bill Ramaley. The retired Professor Emeritus passed on in June.

long-distance train ride through the West to celebrate his 50 years in railroading. With his extended family in four private cars attached to regular Amtrak trains, they toured for more than a week.

Omaha TV station KETV will renovate the former Burlington passenger depot in that Nebraska city. They plan to use the 1898 building beginning in 2015. The Automobile License Plate Collectors Association has voted the Friends of the Union Pacific RR Museum license plate


from Nebraska as the best new plate in the U.S. In 2012, Nebraska introduced the plates to increase support for the U.P. Museum, which coincided with 150th anniversary of the railroad.

Amtrak has received the first of 70 new ACS-64 electric locomotives built in California by Siemens. Some of these 8600 hp, 125 mph locos are being tested in Pueblo, Colorado. See the photos on the next two pages.



# Colorado Railroad Museum Dinosaur Express Train

Fresh Tracks through Prehistory Saturday, July 20 9:00 AM – 5:00 PM

Colorado railroads helped unearth many fossils as railroad tracks were laid. Construction crews often exposed these unusual and fascinating bones as they were digging and laying railroad ties. Trains were then used to transport these 'stone bones' to museums around Colorado and throughout the U.S.

Make "Fresh Tracks through Prehistory" as children sift through sand in search of fossils, keep dinosaur prizes as a memento of their dig, pan for gold, paint dinosaur tracks and enjoy other dino-related activities. Be greeted by multiple dinosaurs whose skeletons have been found all along the Front Range. Follow the dinosaur tracks around the Museum's 15-acre rail yard and listen to the adventurous stories of these prehistoric reptiles during our dinosaur story time.

The Dinosaur Express Train is in collaboration with the Morrison Natural History Museum, Dinosaur Ridge and Triebold Paleontology.
