The Canadian Grey Cup Train

While we Americans celebrate our favorite football teams with beer, snacks and television coverage, up north the Canadians have assembled a special commemorative train to celebrate 100 years of the Grey Cup – Canada's Super Bowl. This fall the train will stop at more than 100 places across Canada. The uniquely decorated F 40PH VIA rail locomotive is the same locomotive that was wrapped in Coors Light advertising as the Silver Bullet Express last year.

The train is a rolling museum that commemorates the 100th anniversary of the Grey Cup. One CFL Car shows the logos of the eight teams in the Canadian Football League. Another car has CFL

players as postage stamps, another way the Canadian Government promotes activities uniquely Canadian through its philatelic department.

D&RGW 278 Update



D&RGW C16 278 is back in Cimarron, Colorado, after a 2-1/2 year cosmetic overhaul. It was retired in 1953 and spent a little time on display in Montrose, Colorado, before being put on display on a bridge span east of Cimarron near the Morrow Point Dam. The past few decades the 278 had started to show some serious signs of decay, metal rusting through and wood rotting. In the Spring of 2010 the 278 was trucked to Mammoth Locomotive Works in Palisade, Colorado, for its overhaul.
