Ed Haley Rides the South Park Line to Leadville in 1936

Beginning in 1929, Ed Haley made several winter journeys from Denver to Leadville on Colorado & Southern's famed South Park line. The last was in early 1937, just prior to abandonment and one year before he became one of the founding members of the Rocky Mountain Railroad Club. Many years later, Ed assembled this program using many of his own photos and others from the Western History Collection at the Denver Public Library. He last gave it for the Club on August 13, 1976. It shows us what Rocky Mountain winter travel was like in an era long before interstate highways.

After Ed's passing in 1997, the Colorado Railroad Museum acquired his entire collection of historical material from his family. This program is presented as a tribute both to one of Colorado's great railroad historians and to celebrate the Club's 75th anniversary. Charles Albi is a retired executive director of the Museum.





Colorado Springs Streetcar Update

The Pikes Peak Historical Street Railway foundation has committed to acquire by donation, a 95% restored Pittsburgh PCC originally built in 1947 that had been updated to an Interurban. With a trolley base and pole, a set of standard gauge trucks (both of which they have) plus some minor work elsewhere, they will have a second operating PCC in service.

They are also preparing four donated Denver RTD vehicles, two 1910 era streetcar bodies and two 1940 trolley buses for transport to Colorado Springs pending funds for the moves.

San Luis & Rio Grande Excursion

September 27, 28 and 29, 2013

On September 27, 28 and 29, 2013, the Club will operate a special three-day excursion on the San Luis & Rio Grande Railroad out of Alamosa, Colorado. All three days will be steam powered using the SL&RG 2-8-0 No 18. The four-car consist will include a Dome, Club, Coach and the Lookout Mountain (an open car).

Day One will be a Mixed Train from Alamosa to Monte Vista and return. Runbys will be included, and passengers will have an opportunity to watch and photograph the switching operations at Monte Vista. Guests will be provided with a sandwich buffet onboard the train.

Day Two will be a roundtrip from Alamosa to La Veta and return. This is the most scenic part of the line, crossing 9,242 foot La Veta Pass. Time permitting we will make two runbys in each direction on the pass. Breakfast will be provided and lunch will be available for purchase (\$8-10 per plate). Complementary non alcoholic beverages will also be provided.

Day Three will be a round trip from Alamosa to Antonito, where we will connect with the C&TS regular train on to Osier, and return to Antonito and Alamosa. (Please note that the C&TS fare is not included and tickets for the Antonito - Osier portion must be purchased from the C&TS. We are working with the C&TS for a special price so be sure to mention you are with RMRRC trip.) Breakfast will be provided onboard the

train between Alamosa and Antonito, and snacks and cocktails will be available for purchase on the return trip. We are planning at least one late afternoon runby on the return trip between Antonito and Alamosa.

When we return to Alamosa on either Day One or Day Two we will have an opportunity to visit the SL&RG Car Shop.

Price for the entire three-day trip (not including C&TS ticket) will be \$179 per person. Ticket sales will be handled by the SL&RG on their Rio Grande Scenic RR web site www.coloradotrain.com. This web site also includes information on lodging and dining in Alamosa.

D&RGW Locomotive 169 In Alamosa, Colorado

Work is progressing on former Denver & Rio Grande Western (nee Denver & Rio Grande) #169 in Cole Park in Alamosa, Colorado.

Owned by the Alamosa Chamber of Commerce / Alamosa County Economic Development Council (ACEDC), the Friends of the 169 volunteer group has been working on the preservation and eventual operation of the 1883-built Baldwin product.

In 2012, the Friends replaced the rusted-out cab floorboards, removed the brake rigging from under the locomotive, removed the driver grease cellars, hosted numerous visitors to the pavilion, and performed many other tasks.

This summer, the Friends began lettering the locomotive and tender using stencils provided by Terry Woolsey of the Friends of the Cumbres & Toltec Scenic Railroad. In addition, the locomotive





and Business Car B-1 were cleaned and partially re-painted in support of the Alamosa County Centennial. Other work included removing the eccentric straps, cylinder bore inspection, and side rod removal to further determine the mechanical condition of the locomotive.

Future work includes boiler repairs, removing and inspecting the valve gear, cleaning and repairing the smokebox interior, fund-raising, and a myriad of other tasks necessary to meet FRA requirements and to make the locomotive operationally reliable.

The Club Tours Como And Surroundings

On Sunday June 9th, the Rocky Mountain Railroad Club (Celebrating their 75th anniversary) in collaboration with the Park County Historical Society, toured the town of Como and other sites in the vicinity. Approximately 40 members of the organizations were in attendance. Members of the Denver South Park and Pacific Historical Society (DSP&PHS) were also in attendance. We had a convoy of members arrive in Como at the Como Roundhouse, Bob Schoppe (President of the DSP&PHS) and Todd Hackett went over many details concerning the Roundhouse that was built in 1879 by Italian Stone Masons. The DSP&P boxcar was rolled out for display, and members marveled at the many interesting aspects of the Roundhouse. Thanks to Doctor Charles Brantigan and Bob Schoppe for allowing the tour of the roundhouse.

From the roundhouse, we drove to the other side of town to the Como Cemetery. We were able to match up the map in our handout, with the burials, to locate where the original land boundary was. (The cemetery was later enlarged) Burials, of well known railroaders were seen, along with others such as the Italian scribed head stone from the 1893 blast at the King Coal Mine, which killed many mine employees.

From the cemetery, we made our way to the Como Hotel and depot. We ordered our lunches, while enjoying the restaurant in the hotel, thinking how so many train passengers ate in the same

room, when the railroad would feed the passengers from the many trains in Como. After lunch, we had some members tour the Depot, while others enjoyed a detailed tour of the Hotel by owner David Tomkins. We were able to see how trains arrived and departed from Como from the vantage point of the hotel. David noted the recent discovery of the once buried, original window opening from the original Gilman / Pacific Hotel, which had burned in 1896 – the current building replaced it. David also told the group of the current restoration projects at the Hotel and Depot.

The depot has been restored to its original level, from the first phase of the restoration, along with a new roof and chimneys. The interior and siding are the

next phases of the project with the depot becoming a museum with original rail-road memorabilia, much from the Andy Anderson collection. Andy was a former Como resident, and RR engineer. The depot has come a long way from 2008, when members from both organizations stabilized the precarious structure. All were enthralled to see the progress on the depot.


We then drove to the site of the King City / Coal mine area. We were able to locate the original sites of many structures of the once busy mining town on the map in the handout. This site was previously named Como also) The day ended and everyone was able to see how Como operated as the hub of the railroad for almost 60 years!


