Trolley, The Cars That Built Denver


Presented by Bruce Vincent March 12th, 2013 • 7:30 PM



Observations About The West Rail Line Excursion

As you can see from the enclosed insert, we are jointly planning and sponsoring an excursion on the soon to be opened West Rail Line. The Club, in partnership with the Colorado Railroad Museum, the Denver Tramway Heritage Society, the Intermountain Chapter of the NRHS, the Jeffco Historical Commission, the Lakewood Heritage Center and the Lakewood Heritage, Culture and the Arts Alliance,

will host a rail enthusiast's special on Saturday, April 20th. Each of the partners has a role in planning and conducting the trip. I have been most impressed how each partner has agreed to work together with each other in a way that has probably never been tried before. There is a lot of overlap of members between these seven organizations as well as common interests that transcend individual agendas. We've all agreed that any profits from this trip will be shared equally among each group. Perhaps this collaboration will lead to more jointly sponsored events in the future. It only makes sense to combine resources and energy when working on historic preservation and educational outreach.

We will meet at the Jefferson County Government Center at 100 Jefferson Parkway at the west end of the new light rail line. The event will start at 9:00 AM with an historical presentation and other information before riding the train. A light Continental breakfast will be provided beginning at 8:30 AM.

A special website has been set up to order tickets for this event. Go to the Club website www.rockymtnrrclub.org and click on the link to the RTD Excursion on the home page. That will direct you to the website that will take your payments and make your reservations. All trip information will be available on the Club website.

Tickets will not go on sale until March 15th. We will close out sales on April 15th or when all tickets are sold.

All tickets are non-refundable. Each ticket is \$25 and a portion of the proceeds will go to historic preservation for the partner organizations

Our thanks to Steve Patterson who provided a most informative and interesting program on the Ski Train, a Denver tradition for 73 years. Combining historic photos and color images, Steve gave a comprehensive presentation that was enjoyed by all. Unfortunately, a few members may have missed the Club meeting on February 12th as the church, at the last minute, moved us to the Music Room on the west end of the building. Signage was makeshift and we apologize if you could not find us. We hope that will not happen again.

At a very busy Board meeting on February 18th, a number of upcoming events and activities were approved. Dave Gross and Rich Luckin are assembling a video to commemorate our 75 years, including movie clips from Otto Perry and other historic images. We are planning a unique motor car excursion over Memorial Day weekend at Wagon Wheel Gap and are working with the Cheyenne Depot Museum to join them on a one-way trip from Denver to Cheyenne behind Union Pacific steam on July 21st. We are also planning a special outing in late September on the Rio Grande Scenic Railroad with the potential for rare mileage between Monte Vista and Center, Colorado. Two driving field trips are being put together over former parts of the Denver, South Park and Pacific and the Florence and Cripple Creek lines. As you can see from the program lineup, we have a number of excellent presentations planned, including a Saturday daytime event in May at the Church to see a special showing of the movie, *Ticket to Tomahawk* featuring Rio Grande Southern locomotive No 20.

Our project for scanning in historical editions of the Rail Report dating back to 1938 is progressing (and complete through 1963). Later this year, we should have almost a complete collection of the Club's newsletters accessible on-line that will be searchable and printable. In the future, we will be adding historic trip flyers, excursion information and other Club memorabilia. I think you will agree, we are busy and hopefully offering Club members some unique experiences during this year's celebration. Several more are in the preliminary planning stages, so stay tuned. DENVER, March 6. – The engineer and fireman of Denver and Rio Grande train No. 315 westbound escaped miraculously today when the locomotive of the train was swept

from the track by a snow slide to the ice clad Gunnison river 37 feet below. None of the passengers was hurt. The accident occurred in the Black Canyon.








75th Anniversary Year Commemorative Membership Cards Watch For The Special Envelope With Your Commemorative Card



Rio Grande Southern Locomotive No. 20 Restoration Fund Raising Campaign

As you know, the Club purchased Rio Grande Southern locomotive No. 20 in 1952 and later donated it to the Museum which is now in the process of restoring this historic locomotive to operating service. It is a costly task.

The Museum has raised over \$900,000 but the total cost is expected to be closer to \$1.4 million dollars. Therefore, the Board of Directors of the Foundation is offering the members a challenge. The board will match dollar for dollar up

to \$10,000 any donations made by our membership in 2013. All donations are tax deductible and will allow the Museum to continue this important project.
